

Earl Plummer: Thoreau, New Mexico

Earl Plummer was born in Gallup, New Mexico in September of 1975. At the age of fourteen Earl learned the basic silversmith techniques from family members. Supporting himself through high school, he advanced his techniques from traditional pieces to lapidary contemporary jewelry. Earl works in both sterling silver and gold and uses fine natural quality gemstones.

His designs are coordinated with nature and traditional patterns. Earl has won several awards at the Gallup Intertribal Indian Ceremonial, 2nd in Squash Blossom at the 2007 Santa Fe Indian Market, 2nd Best in Division Coral Squash Blossom at the 2008 Heard Museum Guild Indian Fair and market. Earl also won Best of Show and Excellence in the Squash Blossom category at the Native American Art

Festival in Litchfield Park, Arizona this past January. In 2009 at The Tesoro Cultural Center's Indian Market Earl won Judges Choice.
