

Roxanne Galindo Shaw: Nederland, Colorado

As a child, Roxanne was inspired to begin making Santos after a trip to Spanish Market in Santa Fe with her mother, Catherine Robles-Shaw. Roxanne began painting and participating in the youth division at Spanish Market, and in 1996 she received the youth division Judge's Award for Unusual Creativity for an Adam and Eve. In 1999, Shaw had the opportunity to study under Santero and family friend Victor Goler through the Developing Artist Program of the Spanish Colonial Arts Society.

Roxanne was allowed to enter Spanish Market as an adult in 2000 and her altar screen piece, containing San Raphael, Guadalupe and San Miguel, was awarded 1st Place - Altar Screens. She won 1st Place in Altar Screens again in 2003. She took 2nd Place in the Retablos category at the Tesoro Cultural Center's 2006 Spanish Market.
